Community Medical Center has always been vigilant in identifying and recording nosocomially acquired infection in our institution. Reporting to external agencies is problematic because of divergent definitions and interpretation of definitions. Community Medical Center's reported numbers fill nationally recognized definitions, which may differ slightly from PHC4's definitions. This leads inevitably to divergent numbers.

Community Medical Center has been compliant in reporting nosocomial infections for our institution. Our facility is safe and a healthful environment for our patients. Our outcomes of care are continually being evaluated. When opportunities for improvement are identified, changes are made and programs implemented to make positive changes for our patients.

Community Medical Center supports the Pennsylvania Health Care Cost Containment Council in its intent to provide hospitals and patients with data on performance. We thank you for the opportunity to comment on our hospital's performance.
